Reversing the Downtrend



Technical Highlights

After hitting its 52-week high of RM7.43 in mid-June 2024, the stock entered a broadbased market correction amid weakening buying interest, eventually bottoming out at its 52-week low. Recently, a resurgence in buying momentum has fuelled a recovery. At last Friday's closing, the stock successfully broke out of the falling triangle pattern, confirming a potential trend reversal and signalling a shift in momentum.

Momentum indicators are showing strength. The RSI continues its positive momentum and climbs upward, indicating sustained buying interest. Similarly, the recent exhibition of golden cross in the MACD further confirms the stock's short-term bullish outlook.

An ideal entry range would be between RM5.75 and RM5.80. The first key resistance stands at RM5.98, followed by RM6.26, the stock's previous support level before the consolidations started. If the stock successfully clears these levels, it could challenge its higher target level at RM6.41. On the downside, if the stock falls below its crucial support level of RM5.60, this could mean a false pattern breakout and the commencement of consolidation phase. Stop loss wise, it can be placed at slightly below the crucial level at RM5.50.

Channel Pattern Breakout



Technical Highlights

Since its IPO debut in early April 2024, the stock had been trading in a persistent downtrend, forming a descending channel as it consolidated within the range. However, last Friday, a surge in buying interest propelled the stock to close significantly higher, registering an 8.1% gain and successfully breaking out of the channel pattern. This breakout signals a potential shift in momentum, reinforcing the case for a trend reversal in the near term.

Momentum indicators are supportive of the trend reversal. The RSI shot up from oversold territory, signalling the return of strong buying interest. Meanwhile, a golden cross was confirmed in the MACD last Friday, suggesting the stock is building up positive momentum in the near term.

Waiting for a slight retracement to the price range between RM0.330 and RM0.335 represents a good entry opportunity. The first resistance is set at RM0.350, and if the stock breaks this level, it could challenge RM0.400, a point that represents the previous high. Conversely, a dip below RM0.300 could invalidate the pattern breakout and suggest the consolidation may continue.

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Glossary of commonly used technical terms

Exponential Moving Average (EMA)	An indicator frequently used in technical analysis showing the average value of a security's price over a set period with greater weightage placed on the most recent data points.
Moving Average Convergence Divergence (MACD)	A trend-following momentum indicator that shows the relationship between two moving averages of prices. The MACD is calculated by subtracting the 26-day exponential moving average (EMA) from the 12-day EMA. A 9-day EMA of the MACD, called the "signal line", is then plotted on top of the MACD, functioning as a trigger for buy and sell signals.
Stochastic	A technical momentum indicator that compares a security's closing price to its price range over a given time period. The indicator's sensitivity to market movements can be reduced by adjusting the time period or by taking a moving average of the result.
Average True Range (ATR)	A measure of volatility whereby the indicator is the greatest of the following: - current high less the current low; - the absolute value of the current high less the previous close; - the absolute value of the current low less the previous close;
Bollinger Band	A band plotted 2 standard deviations away from a simple moving average.
On-Balance Volume (OBV)	A method used in technical analysis to detect momentum, the calculation of which relates volume to price change. OBV provides a running total of volume and shows whether this volume is flowing in or out of a given security.
Support	The price level which, historically, a stock has had difficulty falling below. It is thought of as the level at which a lot of buyers tend to enter the stock.
Resistance	The price at which a stock or market can trade, but not exceed, for a certain period of time. Often referred to as "resistance level".
Reversal	A change in the direction of a price trend. On a price chart, reversals undergo a recognizable change in the price structure. An uptrend, which is a series of higher highs and higher lows, reverses into a downtrend by changing to a series of lower highs and lower lows. A downtrend, which is a series of lower highs and lower lows, reverses into an uptrend by changing to a series of higher highs and higher lows.
Divergence	When the price of an asset and an indicator, index or other related asset move in opposite directions.
Overbought	In technical analysis, this term describes a situation in which the price of a security has risen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that an oscillator has reached its upper bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming overvalued and may experience a pullback.
Oversold	A situation in technical analysis where the price of an asset has fallen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that the oscillator has reached a lower bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming undervalued and may represent a buying opportunity for investors



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
